The MGM Grand is the second largest hotel in the world by number of rooms and the largest hotel resort complex in the United States, ahead of The Venetian. When it opened in 1993, the MGM Grand was the largest hotel in the world. Located on the Strip, the 30-floor main building is 293ft (89m) high and has 5,000 rooms. It's on February 22, 1994, in front of an audience of 17,000 people that the Jackson Family Honors takes place inside of the MGM Grand Garden Arena. The event had been set up to honor Elizabeth Taylor and Berry Gordy. The whole family, including Michael, is present, and many of them take part of the show on stage.

Venetian Hotel §§ Casino & The Madame Tussauds Museum

Opened in 1999, the hotel used Venice, Italy, as its design inspiration, and used to have 4,000 rooms. In 2008, the Venetian merged with the Palazzo and becomes the largest hotel in the world with 7,000 rooms. The design is pretty amazing, and features replicas of famous Venetian landmarks, such as St Mark's Square, the Doge's Palace, or the famous gondolas. The hotel also has a nightclub and a Madame Tussauds museum, which contains a Michael Jackson wax statue. Inside of the Resort Hotel Casino Venetian, you will find the Regis Galerie store. Doesn't sound familiar to you? This is where Michael used to antique shop. It is this exact place that we see in Martin Bashir's controversial documentary "Living with Michael Jackson". At the store's











entrance, screens are now broadcasting the documentary, and Michael's music is played inside the boutique.

of Pop. There, you will get the opportunity to see some of Michael's memorabilia, which include some loafers, Swarovski socks, jackets, and signed merchandise. The show's huge boutique offers a large choice of Bravado merchandise.

Mirage Hotel KK

Michael often stayed in this hotel located on the far end of the Strip. 100 meters tall, 3,000 bedrooms, a 90,000-liters dolphin aquarium, a white tiger cage, about 1,000 palm trees, and a volcano. This is the Mirage, one of Las Vegas' first hotel resorts. The King of Pop often booked the same room, sometimes called "Michael Jackson Lanai", during his trips to the city in the 90s and 2000s. The room costs \$1.250 per night. If you can't afford it, you can still gamble at the casino or enjoy a drink at the hotel's bar.
